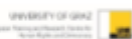

The war in Ukraine has created serious challenges for young people, including loss, displacement, psychological stress, and disruptions to education and career opportunities. Many young Ukrainians have had to adapt to difficult realities and uncertainty about the future. At the same time, these hardships have contributed to the development of youth leadership. Many young people have become active in volunteer movements, humanitarian initiatives, and community support networks. Through this involvement, they have developed leadership skills such as teamwork, communication, and crisis management. Despite the difficulties, Ukrainian youth continue to support their communities and demonstrate resilience and responsibility during a time of crisis.

Andrii Andreichenko is a Doctor of Economics and Full Professor with over 20 years of academic and research experience.
